The Danish team will be chosen from the following:—

FLYWEIGHT.—ERIK MOLLER, I.K., 29, Copenhagen, 25 years of age. Has beaten Marshall, England, at the international match in Copenhagen, 31st October, 1947.

BANTAMWEIGHT.—BENT LARSEN, C.I.K., Copenhagen, 18 years of age. Danish junior champion, 1945. Has beaten Fernelius, Finland; Guiseppe Buccoleri, Italy; Vlemincky, Belgium, and Owen Trainer, England.

FEATHERWEIGHT.—SVEND AAGE SORENSEN, I.K. "Sparta," Aalborg, 21 years of age. Has beaten the Norwegian champion, Udd Ingvaldsen.

LIGHTWEIGHT.—SVEND WAD, I.K. "Semper," Haderslev, 19 years of age. Placed No. 3 in European championships in Dublin, where he won over Del Carlo, Italy, and Chycla, Poland. Defeated Cooper (England) at the international match in Copenhagen, 31st October, 1947.

FEATHERWEIGHT.—FRANK MADSEN, B.K. "Enighed," Copenhagen. 23 years of age. Lost to P. Brander and C. F. Tucker, England, but made an impressive showing against Brander in the international match in Copenhagen, 31st October, 1947. Won over Peter Maguire, Ireland.

LIGHTWEIGHT.—LEIF MADSEN, B.K. "Enighed," Copenhagen. 25 years of age and a brother to the abovenamed Frank. Danish champion in lightweight, 1947, where he beat Svend Wad. Has beaten Beekwilder, Holland; Angelo Neloni, Italy, and Erik Wold, Norway.

WELTERWEIGHT.—VIKTOR JORGENSEN, I.F. "Sparta," Copenhagen. 23 years of age. Copenhagen champion in welterweight, 1947. Has beaten Jim Cramer, England; Burniston, England, and Steen Ahnelöv, Sweden. Has lost to Ryan, England, and Cantwell, Ireland.

MIDDLEWEIGHT.—EJNER NIELSEN, C.I.K., Copenhagen. 27 years of age. Danish champion in Middleweight 1945/46. Has beaten van der Kurk, Holland; Jim Smith, England, and Sture Olsson, Sweden.

WELTERWEIGHT.—CHRISTIAN CHRISTENSEN, A.K. "Falken," Frederikssund. 21 years of age. Represented Denmark in European championships at Dublin, where he beat Flanigan, Scotland, Danish champion, 1947. Lost to Ryan at the international match in Copenhagen, 31st October, 1947.

MIDDLEWEIGHT.—GUNNAR ANDREASSEN, F.A.K., Aarhus. 33 years of age. Has won over McNamee, Ireland. Lost on casting vote to Agland at the international match in Copenhagen, 31st October, 1947, but knocked down the Englishman twice. Danish champion for 1947.

LIGHT-HEAVYWEIGHT.—ERIK JENSEN, F.A.K., Aarhus. 26 years of age. Has beaten Frank Bell (in Aarhus in December, 1946), and E. Keefe, Ireland. Lost on casting vote to Taylor at the international match in Copenhagen, 31st October, 1947. Danish champion in light-heavyweight 1946/47.

HEAVYWEIGHT.—GOTTSCHALCK-HANSEN, Hillerod S.C., Hillerod. 19 years of age. Has beaten Bruno Luigi, Italy.

Who's Who on Ireland's Team

FLYWEIGHT.—W. E. BARNES (Victory B.C., Belfast). Irish Senior champion 1944 and 1947., and Ulster champion for several years. Represented Ireland in the European championships. Had a good victory over M. Dikey (Belgium) last August. A fast elusive boxer of distinct class.

BANTAMWEIGHT.—W. LENEHAN (Arbour Hill B.C., Dublin). Champion of Ireland, 1941, and many times National Juvenile champion. Has beaten R. Bissell (A.B.A. England champion) twice, and is probably the most colourful boxer of recent years.

FEATHERWEIGHT.—J. CONNOLLY (Corinthians, Dublin). National Junior Champion, 1945. A strong, clever boxer, he has represented Ireland on four occasions, scoring a notable victory over R. Latham (Great Britain).

LIGHTWEIGHT.—M. McCULLAGH (Corinthians, Dublin). Irish champion, 1947, and one of the most experienced members of our team. Represented Ireland in the European championships and in no fewer than fourteen Internationals. Has beaten, amongst others, E. Thomas (A.B.A. champion), Del Carlo (Italy), Vissers (Belgium), Hansen (Denmark), Findlay (Scotland) and Williamson (A.B.A. champion).

WHO'S WHO ON IRELAND'S TEAM—(Contd.)

WELTERWEIGHT.—M. BYRNE (Galway B.C.). Irish Junior champion, 1945, and several times holder of the Connacht title. One of the younger school, his strong, rugged style won him his place on the Irish side which recently visited Sweden. On this occasion he defeated O. Larsen.

MIDDLEWEIGHT.—M. McKEON (Imperial Tobacco Co. B.C., Dublin). Has held the National Senior Title for the past three years. His whole-hearted, relentless attack and his superb fitness have won him great popularity. Has represented Ireland in fourteen Internationals and has a victory over the present European champion, Escudié of France. Other notable successes to his credit are victories over Fontana (Italy), Hansen (Denmark), Watson (Great Britain), Anspach (U.S.A.) and Kerswell (Wales).

CRUISERWEIGHT.—H. TAYLOR (Royal Ulster Constabulary, Belfast). Champion of Ireland, 1946 and 1947, and several times Ulster champion. Taylor is an exponent of the orthodox stance and style. Has a distinguished International record which includes victories over Hauenstein (France), Tucker (U.S.A.) and J. Taylor (Great Britain).

HEAVYWEIGHT.—G. O. COLMAIN (Tuaisciart na Cathrach Club, Dublin). European champion, 1947; Cruiserweight champion of Ireland, 1943 and 1944, and holder of the National Heavyweight Title for the past two years. Has an impressive International record with victories over the representatives of Great Britain, U.S.A., Italy, Sweden, Scotland and Wales. Represented Europe against America, 1947.
